#### **BACKGROUND**

The organisation is in the 114<sup>th</sup> year of its operation and remains a non for profit organisation. Deaf Services Queensland has grown from originally a welfare based business, to now a professional business. The current revenue for the business is a mix of government funding and fee for service activity. Key services provided by the organisation include: Auslan interpreting, Auslan translations, employment support services, Auslan classes, independent living support, deaf awareness training and children and families support. Currently 30-40 workshops throughout Queensland are run each week, involving activities that connect the deaf community on a daily basis etc. use of Go-cards and grocery shopping. Deaf Services Queensland has several offices throughout Queensland where training and assessment will occur. The organisation currently offers non RTO training and assessment services.



The organisation does not intend on:

- working with third parties in the recruitment of students or provision of training and assessment services
- collecting fees in advance as per the requirements of clause 7.3.

During the site audit the organisation withdrew CHC40312 Certificate IV in Disability. On 19<sup>th</sup> May 2015 the organisation's CEO provided an email confirming the decision to withdraw the qualification from the initial registration application.
